He has seen the fall of ESRI's ArcIMS, the rise of ESRI's ArcGIS Server and the introduction and maturing of ESRI's ArcGIS Portal. The maturing of Business Intelligence platforms such as PowerBI are now converging the analytics space between traditional GIS and data visualization.



Anthony Criscitelli

Anthony has been responsible for the City of Adelaide's Intranet and associated business processes managed therein from the days of handcrafted HTML pages through to iterations of SharePoint and now Office365. Along the way he has managed those processes with Infopath forms, Nintex Workflow and associated tools through to the Power Platform today. Anthony continues to manage SharePoint and the PowerPlatform and champions education and training throughout the organisation in addition to his primary role of customer engagement to further develop process benefits for stakeholders.

11:55	<p>Psychology of Lying</p> <p><u>Description:</u></p> <p>Dr Melville’s presentation will look at the psychology of workplace dishonesty, with a focus on matters relating to IT and information management. Workplace dishonesty does not occur in a vacuum and can be best explained by three factors: motivated offenders, the availability of suitable targets, and the absence of capable guardians. The presentation will look how each of these factors can manifest in IT and information management, particularly examining the typical failures in policies and procedures which allow corruption to occur. These include the failure of IT managers to declare and manage conflicts of interest, inadequate recruitment processes for highly specialised IT contractors, shortcuts in the procurement of IT services, and the failure to secure sensitive information against unauthorised access and disclosure.</p> <p><u>Presenter:</u></p> <p>Dr Angela Melville, Principal Prevention Analyst, Independent Commission Against Corruption</p> <p><i>Dr Melville holds a PhD in sociology and anthropology from the University of Newcastle, Australia and a Bachelor of Arts honours degree in sociology and psychology. She was previously the Teaching Program Director for Criminology at Flinders University. She has also worked at the International Institute for Sociology of Law in Spain, the University of Manchester and the University of Newcastle upon Tyne. She has published extensively on professional negligence, compensation, the experiences of litigants, and the legal profession.</i></p>

11:45	<p>Award Winner 2021 – LG Enterprise Software Transition to Datascape</p> <p><u>Description:</u></p> <p>This session will discuss Council’s award winning project to select and implement a modern Local Government Enterprise Software System (LGES) and partner that could enable innovation and efficiency across the organisation. In late 2019 Council selected Datascape as its new replacement software. Datascape is a brand new LGES solution, developed by Datacom for implementation in both Australia and New Zealand. Wattle Range Council was the first South Australian Council to take on the software and the fourth nationwide.</p> <p><u>Presenter:</u></p> <p>Paul Duka, Director of Corporate Services, Wattle Range Council</p> <p><i>Paul Duka is a CPA qualified accountant with 17 years’ experience in Regional Local Government Councils in South Australia. Paul has for the last 7 years been the Director Corporate Services with the Wattle Range Council, leading transformational ICT change within Council.</i></p> <p><i>In 2019, the Wattle Range team commenced the process of tendering and contracting a new replacement Local Government Enterprise Software System. Awarding the contract to a brand-new Local Government Enterprise Software system provider Datascape in December 2019.</i></p> <p><i>In 2021 the Wattle Range Council IT Project Team were awarded the LGITSA “IT Team of the Year” for the implementation of a largely untried software system, during a pandemic with limited resources under tight time constraints.</i></p>

12:15	<p>State of the State's Data – SA's Chief Data Officer</p> <p><u>Description:</u></p> <p>Never before have citizens so actively looked for data to inform their lives day-to-day, until recently. A focus during the COVID-19 pandemic required rapid response and new collaborations across borders to coordinate an approach and collate the data. In this session, South Australia's Chief Data Officer will share some of the learnings over recent years, and directions for data in South Australia, as the focus returns to progressing a state data strategy.</p> <div><p><u>Presenter:</u> Peter Worthington-Eyre, Chief Data Officer, South Australian Government</p><p><i>Mr Peter Worthington-Eyre is the Chief Data Officer of the Government of South Australia and the Executive Director of the Office for Data Analytics, Department of Premier and Cabinet. He leads the whole-of-government Office for Data Analytics in implementing analytics initiatives across government, supporting evidence-based service design and using predictive analytics to inform policy development. As Chief Data Officer for the South Australian Government, he is entrusted to ensure the value of the vast data assets of the SA government are unlocked and appropriately governed. He was formerly Director for Actuarial, Analytics and Reporting of ReturnToWorkSA. He led a team of actuaries, analytics and reporting professionals across all aspects of the business including pricing, economic modelling and claims operations. Previously he was Director for Reporting and Business Solutions of WorkCoverSA and a Senior Performance Analyst of the Department of Premier and Cabinet.</i></p></div>

1:55	<p>Digital Tree Canopy</p> <p><u>Description:</u> Council created a tree canopy map of its City using Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR), which uses laser pulses from an overflying plane. Only canopy 3m or taller was captured across both public and private land. The results create a 3-D map of the canopy cover to a 10cm resolution. Council then used Geographic Information Systems (GIS) to overlay each LiDAR dataset over property boundaries to give individual property detail.
